## What are we designed to do?

I read a quote recently in a ministry book that hit home for me.

*"Your ministry is designed perfectly to achieve the results you are currently getting"* – Andy Stanley

While this is certainly true in the church world, it could also be applied to just about every area of life.

Nevertheless, it amazes me how often we believe that we can achieve different results without changing anything about what we do. Just because I want to lose ten pounds doesn't mean I will, if I don't change my diet or exercise. Just because I want to get better grades in school doesn't mean I will, if I don't work harder. Just because I want to grow deeper spiritually doesn't mean I will, if I don't invest more of myself. Just because we as a church want to make a bigger impact on our world with the gospel doesn't mean we will, if we don't push ourselves beyond what we grown accustomed to do.

As we continue through this new sermon series, *"Acts: The*

*Ministers, Message, Mission, and Method of the Church"*, we will see the results the early church achieved and be amazed. We will see men and women empowered by the Holy Spirit to take the gospel to new places and people. We'll see the people unwilling to compromise their faith even if it costs them their possessions, their personal agendas and even their lives. We'll see God doing miracles through the apostles, and we'll see the church grow exponentially despite intense persecution. And hopefully, we'll be inspired!

Our goal is to not just to see amazing results, but also an amazing design from which we can learn and emulate. If we want to see results like these we must also be willing to invest and change. We must push ourselves farther than we've gone before.

What does this all mean? Is there a practical easy to follow formula we can follow? I wish. The truth is, the reason why the church in Acts got the results they did, was because God moved among them,

and they obeyed. They didn't hold back. They didn't waver. They didn't ask God to fit into their already overcrowded life according to their convenience. They allowed God to shape their lives. Understand, these were people just like us, with families, careers, hobbies, bills, and maybe even kids in sports. They were regular people. But God did amazing things through them because when push came to shove, Acts tell us that they were "devoted" to the life of the church and faith (Acts 2:42-47). Does that describe you? Does it describe me? Are the results we're getting when it comes to our faith all we hope for? Is there more from God for us? If we want to achieve different results, better results, we must not seek to create the result, that's God's job. We must create the design of our lives so that we can obey and follow God into his plan for us. Once we do, we will see and achieve results like never before.

# Giving... Made Easy!!

At Marion First United Methodist Church, there are many options for you to give your tithes and offerings to the General Budget, Building Fund, or Foundation.

### 1. Placing your gifts in the offering plate

Please make sure that your check or envelope is marked clearly with your name and where you would like your gift to go towards. Gifts that are not designated, will go to the General Budget.

### 2. Automatic Withdrawal Giving Program (ACH)

This program allows you to have your gifts directly withdrawn from your checking or savings account, either on a weekly schedule, or on the 1st, 8th, 15th, or 22nd of each month. If you would like to enroll in this program, you can download the enrollment form at [www.fumcmarion.org/links.html](http://www.fumcmarion.org/links.html)

### 3. Online Giving

This program allows you to give your tithes and offerings using your debit or credit card or using e-check (entering your information located on your check). This program allows you to make one time or recurring gifts. There is a one-time sign up to the program.

Online giving can also be used using your mobile device. Click on [www.easytithe.com/fumc](http://www.easytithe.com/fumc) or, if you have a QR reader, here is the QR Code that will take you directly to the mobile application.



### 4. Bill Pay Service

You can also use a bill pay service, typically through your bank, to send the Church your gifts. Check with your financial institution for more information.
