Shadows Prove Light

Taking what they called a night walk at Camp Aldersgate (which is a hike in the dark) with a group of dads and first graders, our college age guide instructed the kids to turn off their flashlights and stand still. On that muggy July night near the top of a hill in a southwest Iowa timber we stood on a worn dirt path in what initially seemed to be total darkness.

"Wait for the shadows" our guide said, "when you can see them, they will prove there is light."

She went on to tell the first graders and their parents that there can't be shadows without light. So, if you are in darkness, you can just walk towards the shadows because the light is always on the other side. It made sense then and now.

In a well meaning attempt to calm human fears someone once wrote: "Never fear shadows... they simply

mean there's a light shining somewhere nearby." While like the words of my teenage guide at camp, this seems true; on a spiritual level it seems more complicated sometimes than a walk in the woods. Lost in the woods, even in total darkness, adults know that we can also just wait out the darkness until the rising sun casts its light on the earth once again.

For the things we struggle with in the shadows of our lives, for those physical, emotional and spiritual things that interfere with our right thinking, feeling and even believing walking into them or waiting for a sunrise is most trying. Progress towards the light is slow, the voice of despair whispers in our ear, our most extreme limits tested. Where is the hope in our darkened brokenness?

On Easter Sunday in our worship we will sing the words:

*Up from the grave he arose;
With a mighty triumph o'er his foes;
He arose a victor from the dark domain,*

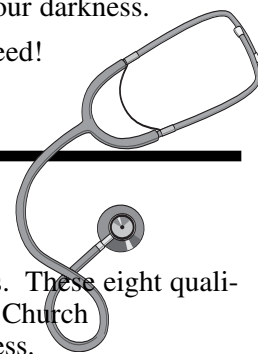
And he lives forever, with his saints to reign.

He arose! He arose!

Hallelujah! Christ arose!

These words call us to the truth that just behind every shadow the light of healing, wholeness and victory is shining. It is true that he rose there and then, and it is also true that he rises here and now so that in the things that throw a shadow over your living and seem to threaten the health of your spirit you might know your redeemer lives with you here and now and his light will defeat your darkness.

Christ is risen indeed!

Waiting in the Examination Room

A church health assessment process is akin to a periodic checkup with a physician. The patient in this case is the Marion FUMC and has scheduled a physical and the doctor has scheduled a few tests. And the doctor has asked FUMC to go out and wait for the tests results.

As many of you may already know through *The Marion Methodist* (March 20th) article, church worship time announcement, being called to participate or knowing someone that will participate in the April 5th (Palm Sunday) questionnaire. In reading the recent copies of *The Marion Methodist* and announcements in the church bulletins this is an exciting time to be a member of Marion FUMC. So why does an assessment need to be taken? A wise person once said, 'Don't confuse activity with accomplishment.' We all can relate to becoming very active in many very important missions and projects, but is this sustainable for a healthy church? The 30 individuals that were selected are being asked to evaluate the FUMC's activities that focus on eight quality characteristics: Empowering Leadership, Gift-oriented Ministry, Passionate Spirituality, Functional structures, Inspiring Worship Services, Holistic Small Groups, Need-oriented

Evangelism, and Loving Relationships. These eight quality characteristics make up the Natural Church Development (NCD) assessment process.

An NCD facilitator is being used to lead the 30 members during the questionnaire portion. The facilitator is being provided as a service to the FUMC from the Iowa United Methodist Conference. After the questionnaire is completed only the NCD facilitator will handle the questionnaire forms to ensure the process is objective and the results are impartial.

Results of the questionnaires will be available to the church body in the weeks following Easter Sunday. So keep listening to the announcements and reading *The Marion Methodist* for future news of the Mission Control committee. At this time the Mission Control committee wants to thank those members in advance for their time, prayers, presence and gifts of honest evaluation of the Marion FUMC. Your Mission Control committee members are the following: Melissa Walker, Tracy Budzinski, Sherri Martin, Barry Soukup, Becky Gerber, Lois Novak, Laurie Mortensen, Dan Ciha, Eric Brown, and Pastor Mike Morgan.

Prayer Vigil - What's that?

A prayer vigil is a time set aside in the life of the church to be in prayer. Prayer vigils have been part of Holy Week observance at FUMC for many years. The Good Friday prayer vigil is a 24 hour observance from noon on Good Friday (4/10) until noon on Saturday (4/11).

Why have a prayer vigil? During the Good Friday prayer vigil, we are observing the time that Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane with his disciples, before he was arrested.

"They went to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I pray". Keep awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." (Mark 14:32,38)

What do you do at a prayer vigil? It is a time of prayer, meditation, reflection, and one-on-one time with God. You may bring your own Bible or devotional materials, but there are also devotional materials provided as well as suggested topics for prayer and reflection.

How long do I stay? As long as you like. You can sign up for 1/2 hour or hour increments, but you may stay as long as you like beyond your scheduled time.

Where is the vigil held? In the sanctuary, the chapel, or the prayer room.

How do I sign up? Look for sign up sheets in the narthex outside the sanctuary, in the hallway beside the chapel, outside the prayer room and in Fellowship Hall. You may also contact by email Vicki Standley at vicki@fumcmari-on.org or call the church office at 377-4856.

Also - In your pew pockets, you will find colored slips of paper titled "Please Pray for". If you have a prayer request or concern that you would like someone to pray for, please fill it out and put it in the prayer box located on the Welcome Center or place it in the offering plate. These will be prayed over as part of the Good Friday prayer vigil.

What's the Process of Rebuilding a Home?

Below is a basic outline. Of course, each house is unique requiring special attention and creative carpentry. But, this gives you an idea of what we are doing in the rebuild process.

UMCOR (The Flood Recovery Office of the United Methodist Church is referred to as UMCOR) receives a referral from the Linn Area Long Term Recovery Coalition.

- One of 20 volunteer Case Managers and an Estimator visits the home together to talk with the homeowner, take measurements, and discuss the rebuild process. The homeowner signs releases so UMCOR has permission to work on the home and to collaborate with other agencies.
- The Case Manager and Estimator make sure the home has been completely gutted and is free of mold.
- Our Project Manager, Curt Liscum, secures the proper building permits and inspections.
- Our trips to Menards begin. Many deliveries, gopher runs, cabinet designs, and troubleshooting.
- Volunteer licensed plumbers and electricians begin their work. If the home needs a furnace, a contractor is hired.
- Volunteers install insulation, drywall, windows, and exterior doors.
- Volunteers mud, tape and, sand. This takes a long time.
- A volunteer from Saint Paul's UMC textures the walls.
- Volunteers prime and paint, install kitchen cabinets and the bathroom vanity. They install window trim, baseboards, crown molding, and interior doors.
- Contractor comes in to lay the flooring.
- The volunteer electrician completes the electrical work by installing outlets and switches.
- Volunteers fix and finish little projects.
- UMCOR holds a House Blessing, during which they pray over the home and homeowner, and the homeowner is given a prayer shawl and cookbook. The homeowner signs off on the work completed.

It takes roughly 3 months to rebuild a home, start to finish. Start begins when mechanicals are complete (electric, plumbing, furnace). The average home requires 2,000 volunteer hours and countless amounts of love, tears, patience, encouragement, and prayer. Homeowners, at an average home, spend about \$13,000 from FEMA and Jumpstart funds to complete their home. If additional funds are needed (beyond FEMA and Jumpstart), the Flood Recovery Office will seek funding from the Iowa Annual Conference, Linn Area Long Term Recovery Center Roundtable, and grants. Private donors, churches, and former work teams have also contributed to the rebuild process.

Pray for the Red River Residents as they clean up from the water. Watching a town go underwater is different when you can remember your own town.

A huge thank you to all who work behind the scenes to support Flood Recovery Efforts. Those who clean the Flood Office, clean the sleeping rooms, clean the bathrooms, organize the trailers, take pictures, clean homes prior to move in, pick up supplies at Menards, move trailers, organize scrapbooks, work on excel documents, get scheduled to paint only to not be able to due to delays, make cookies, make meals, assist with deliverers, and more. Without you, the rebuild efforts would be complicated and behind schedule. Praise Jesus for your willingness to serve. – Pastor Melisa

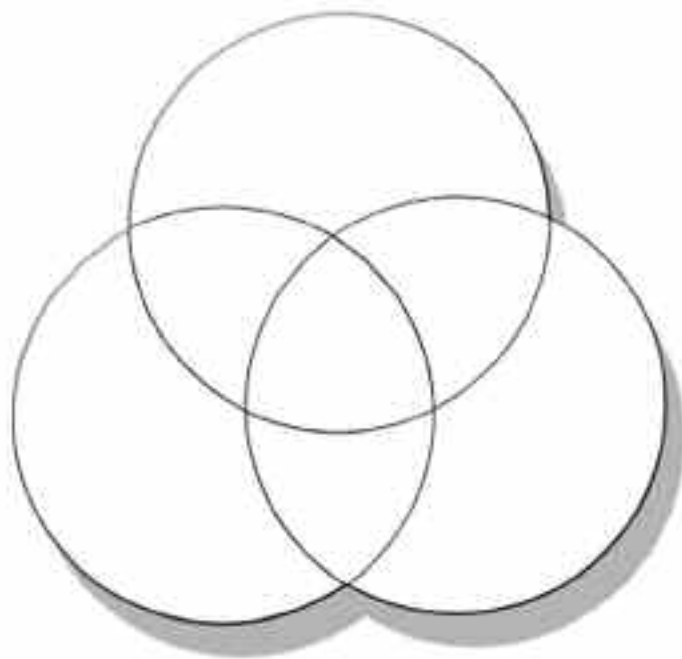
