## Have you heard the one about?

We like good stories. We like good stories in movies, the theater, at gatherings of friends and family and in our walk with the Lord. We like to hear the stories of the good things God is doing in the lives of others.

A favorite stanza in a favorite hymn sings: *I love to tell the story of unseen things above, of Jesus and his glory, of Jesus and his love. I love to tell the story, because I know 'tis true; it satisfies my longings as nothing else can do.* So allow me a few lines to tell a few stories of part of the Jesus story that is unfolding right now.

Once upon a time (July 20, 2009) after telling the story of Jesus and Nicodemus the Rev. Craig Peters issued a simple invitation to those gathered at Summer Games University to receive their new identity in Christ. Many junior high and high school students came forward to pray with their pastors to receive that new identity, some searching, some following friends, some sincerely pursuing the new identity. The story they write with their lives is one I look forward to hearing.

Once upon a time (July 23, 2009), after telling a story that shared the intersection of her life and the gospel, the Rev. Helen Parks gave a simple invitation to those gathered at Summer Games University. Her invitation was specifically for those who felt God was calling them to some type of ministry with their life. Nine young men and women related to FUMC responded to this call, the call to possibly take on the identity of a pastor, youth leader, chaplain, Christian teacher or the like. The story they write with their lives is one I look forward to hearing.

Once upon a time (July 26, 2009), a simple call was made at the four worship services at First United Methodist Church. I asked those who felt that "today was the day" for them to receive God's grace in a new way to simply raise their hand during a prayer time. To date, five friends or members of the church have shared with me that "it all came together for them" during that moment. The story they write with their lives is one I look forward to seeing.

Once upon a time (July 28, 2009), a F.L.Y. worker was handed a letter from a family we serve (see the text of this letter elsewhere in this newsletter) referring to those from First Church that were the servants of FLY as her family's "angels." Praise the Lord; that is a really good story.

These are just a week's worth of stories, each worthy of sharing. As your pastor, I encourage you to share your faith story, ask to hear and pay attention to the stories that others share with you of the great things that God is doing in their lives. The line of the hymn regarding telling the story of God's activity in our lives: "it satisfies my longings as nothing else can do" should encourage us to see that telling our story is really important.

Look for a moment, not aggressively or to "ram Jesus in someone's face" but for the moment when you can simply say to a friend, relative, acquaintance or neighbor, "have you heard the one about how Christ changed my life?" Trust me, people like stories, they will listen and they might for God's sake be changed. Tell your story. – Mike

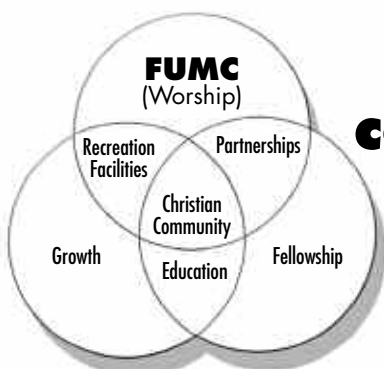

# **New Block by Block Flood Program**

The United Methodist Conference, the Affordable Housing Network (AHNI), and Matthew 25 Hub, have signed a memorandum of understanding to form a partnership called "Block by Block". The funding for this project comes from private dollars; donors who would like to see housing recovery progress for flood affected homeowners and neighborhoods. We received a one million dollar donation from John and Dyan Smith and \$700,000 from the Greater Cedar Rapids Community Foundation. The Iowa Conference has so far committed \$200,000 and an army of volunteers to the project.

The Block by Block Program is a new neighborhood rehabilitation effort in the city of Cedar Rapids. The goal of the program is to bring back to life neighborhoods impacted by 2008's unprecedented flooding, one complete block at a time.

All along this process I have been referring to the fact that we are going to start buying houses, rebuilding them and selling them to low income families. But Block by Block is more than just buying houses. The goal of Block by Block is to build upon the tremendous work already done by blocks, providing resources to make each property on the block fully habitable. Private contributions and customized solutions will provide flexibility to finish what others have started. So, we may be providing funding gaps and volunteers and rebuilding with homeowners (which we've already been doing for the past year), buying homes-rebuilding them and reselling, helping with the buyout process; whatever it takes to make the neighborhood whole again, block by block.

On Tuesday, July 28 a press conference was held at the location of the first block chosen for the program. It was simply a great day for everyone involved! What a blessing that we have been given the privilege of being part of this partnership! ## Giving Our Hearts Away- Native American Survival-

will be the topic of our annual UMW Mission Day on **August 27**. We will meet in the chapel at 9:45 AM for coffee and the meeting will start at 10:00 AM. Everyone is to bring a sack lunch. Beverages will be furnished. Dessert will be furnished by the UMW officers at the end of the day.

At the time of Christopher Columbus' arrival in the new world that would be called "America", there were approximately 100 million inhabitants of the land. In 2000, figures show Native populations in the United States at about 4 million. WHAT HAPPENED?

Nellie Long from the Oklahoma Missionary Conference (Native American) writes: "It's hard for some people to realize that we are the original inhabitants here. Today, we live a reality different than anyone else in the United States. We often feel invisible, and are treated like second-class citizens. We carry government-issued identity cards (Certificate of Degree of Indian Blood) as well as tribal cards that say what tribe we come from. These cards give us access to tribal health care and benefits. No other group in the US has to carry such an identity card to gain benefits. Many people simply don't know this fact."

Please come and hear the **REST of Nellie's story**. The Rev. Jim Campbell will tell us about the Native Americans in Alaska and The Rev. Jan Zirkovsky will help us understand the people who live in the Meskwaki Settlement near Tama.

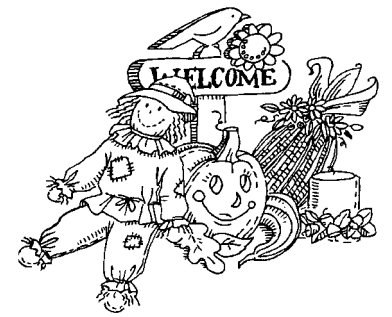
1-30 cm metric ruler                      1-2 1/2" eraser

Many are within our churches, held captive by guilt and shame, fearing others would shun them if their past were discovered. In addition, we are also passionate about ministering to those who have been wounded by a past abortion decision, who were deceived into believing it was a good choice that would get their lives "back on track."
