## The Journey

I have been fortunate enough to have traveled to Israel twice and desire to go again – soon. Because of those trips I have been asked many times if I felt any different being there than I do here. The answer, of course, is YES. To be in a boat on the Sea of Galilee, to stand in the synagogue in Capernaum where Jesus taught and to commune at the Garden Tomb are among the very powerful and high moments in my spiritual life. I will always point to these trips as moments in which the words of the Bible sprung off their pages into my heart and during which my spiritual life was widened.

The next question then is — “must I go to Israel to have high spiritual moments?” The answer to which is obviously NO. The majority of the high spiritual moments in my life have been experienced in the churches in which I worship and among the people with whom my daily routine is lived out. God is everywhere we are and God incidents happen when and where those seeking God have their eyes wide opened to God’s presence.

Because most of us cannot go to “the Holy Land” we must daily strive to make the land we live in holy. Touring Israel, one visits many holy sights, places that point to significant moments in the life of God and his people. Visiting those places, the pilgrim is guided toward deeper and richer faith. Likewise the Christian year points us toward “seeing” significant moments in the life of God and his people and is designed to point us towards deeper and richer faith.

We need high moments like Christmas to celebrate God’s coming into the world, Pentecost to celebrate the universality of Christ’s church and Easter which celebrates God’s huge victory over death and his invitation for us to receive it. Just as those who have traveled with me to Israel over the years prepared for the moments by reading scripture and praying, so we must prepare to see the great sights of the Christian year.

To see the “sights” of Easter: an empty grave, unused burial garments and a stone rolled away, we must prepare. The 40 days and six Sundays of Lent are for that preparation. During this time every Christian is called to prepare spiritually for Easter. This preparation must be personal and intentional and can take many forms. You may desire to “give something up” as an act of self denial or you may choose to “take something up” such as daily devotional or joining a Bible study group.

My trips to Israel are deeply cherished. In them, the Scriptures came alive because I diligently read the stories before seeing the sights. The same is true for each of us as we approach the journey through Lent. Make no mistake, Easter is coming. The question is: can you deeply experience and cherish the risen Christ if you take no time to prepare for his coming? In his name, I encourage to prepare yourself this Lent for the magnificent sight that is Easter.
