What on earth are *we* here for?
A CHURCHWIDE SPIRITUAL GROWTH CAMPAIGN

40 Days of Community moves people from focusing on God's purposes in their personal lives - "What on Earth am I here for?" - to focusing on God's purposes in their church and community - "What on Earth are **WE** here for?"

You may have seen *40 Days of Community* in the bulletin and newsletter articles, and heard us talking about it over the past few weeks. *40 Days of Community* is an effort to **strengthen the church by increasing our sense of community within the church through the ministry of small groups.** Our intention is that these **small groups will continue to meet beyond the campaign and become part of the fabric of our ministry.** The natural outcome of a strengthened church is that we are better able to minister to our community and the world. That's what we want to do here at Marion First United Methodist Church (FUMC) through this spiritual growth campaign.

Beginning April 19th, nearly 60 groups all around Marion will be meeting in homes to discover how we are **better together**, by studying five purposes which will deepen our sense of community within the church. We'll also be deepening our relationships with each other and building community spirit in our neighborhoods. Each small group will participate in a mission project of their choosing. A list of suggested projects can be found on FUMC's website under 40 Days of Community.

During this campaign to **strengthen the church**, the concentrated focus of our worship services, children and adult Sunday School classes, and the small groups, will be on God's five Purposes in Christian community. 40 Days of Community has a destination: to journey to the place where we are deepening God's five Purposes in community within our church, and where we are serving the community around our church. These five Purposes are:

1. Evangelism: Reaching Out Together
2. Fellowship: Belonging Together
3. Discipleship: Growing Together
4. Ministry: Serving Together
5. Worship: Worshiping Together

A Personal Story *by Carrie Walker*



Do you love to attend church service, hear our pastors speak, and greet your Christian neighbors each Sunday? Have you ever thought there could be more, or sought a deeper connection with your church community? Thanks to our church leadership, you have that opportunity through 40 Days of Community. It's coming to FUMC April 19th.

40 Days of Community is a six-week journey to strengthen our church through small group ministry. Think small groups aren't for you? Please think again!

Small group ministries have given me a more meaningful connection to my church family. Four years ago I knew very few people in our congregation, but I sought a more personal bond. I asked myself: "Who are the people I worship with? Do they think the same thoughts as I? Do they thank God for their blessings, but sometimes feel lost? What can I learn from them?"

I joined a women's group almost three years ago. This group had an almost immediate impact on me. They are amazing women of faith and support, and true role models for me in my walk with Christ. I was also involved in a small group ministry that provided my husband and me with a great connection to other couples and families in our church. I doubt I would have had the opportunity to know these friends on a personal level had it not been for the small group experience.

One obstacle for someone my age (and with small children!) is time. Many of us value time with our families, and we should. I just ask you to consider making your relationship with your church family a priority for six weeks in April and May. Who knows what might come of this experience? You might gain a few new friends. You might know a few more faces on Sunday mornings, and some of their joys and concerns. You might gain a deeper understanding of God's purpose for our church. And you just might find a lasting connection to Team FUMC!

Don't wonder what it's like to be part of 40 Days of Community; be part of it. Pray that, through all of us, God's love will shine through.

To strengthen our church!**

One would think that with all the technology we have today that we would be well connected to each other. After all, we have e-mail, text messaging, Facebook, and MySpace. We can even Twitter each other. All of these are social messaging utilities for staying connected.

The reality is, that in spite of all of this technology, we are not truly connected. Do we really know each other? Do people really know you? We long for personal relationships where we can share our joys and laugh together and, at times, bare our souls and share each other's sorrows and struggles.

As a church, we can be a source of strength and an influence for the love and grace of God to our community because we are strong and healthy ourselves. As we further strengthen our church through small groups, building personal relationships, we will realize that we are better together in our ministry and mission.

**How are we going to build relationships?
By establishing small groups!**

Marion FUMC has a number of Sunday worship services. We can't get to know each well through worship alone. We want to follow the early church's model of Christian community, which was lived out on three fronts:

1. In the temple courts (worship)
2. House-to-house (small groups - host homes - fellowship/discipleship)
3. In the neighborhoods and community around them (mission)

Open your home for a video seminar,
Serve some coffee or soft drinks and
Tell your friends.

Small groups were transformational for the early church, and they will be for Marion FUMC as well.

The desired outcome of this 40 Days of Community, a churchwide spiritual growth campaign, is to strengthen the church and establish small group ministry.

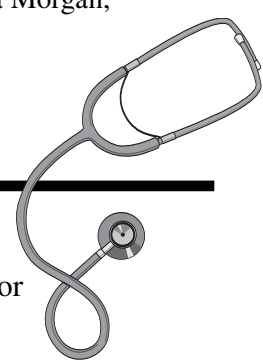

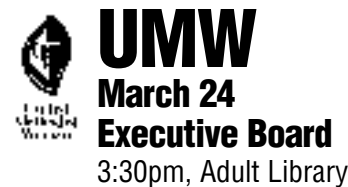

Time for a Church Family Check-Up

Just as a periodic checkup with a physician is recommended to monitor our health status and make life style changes for long-term health benefits, so it is time for FUMC to have a church health assessment.

The Mission Control committee is charged with this assessment. The initial planning stage is to engage selected members of our church in a questionnaire. We will provide results and follow-up to the church body in the way of feedback, action planning, doing, and evaluation using a proven process called Natural Church Development. The Mission Control committee believes this assessment will provide valuable information to objectively evaluate FUMC's health. Mission Control will be calling and asking 30 FUMC members to participate in a questionnaire on Palm Sunday, April 5. These individuals were selected thoughtfully, prayerfully, and purposefully. They represent a cross section of our congregation, including all age groups and ministry areas within the church. The process will focus on evaluating eight quality characteristics of a healthy church: Empowering Leadership, Gift-oriented Ministry, Passionate Spirituality, Functional Structures, Inspiring Worship Services, Holistic Small Groups, Need-oriented Evangelism, and Loving Relationships. These eight qualities can be transferred to FUMC's current status, providing a picture of where we are and suggesting emphasis for the future. Each of the qualities has a positive relationship with both the quality and magnitude of growth for a church.

The information obtained from the questionnaire will be available to everyone and will provide FUMC a health status of its ministry. From this information, specific action steps can be developed to focus on areas of needed improvement, as well as reinforcing our many strengths.

What can you do? If you are contacted in the near future and asked to participate, please prayerfully consider agreeing to spend 90 minutes on April 5 to participate in the questionnaire. Everyone else can offer prayers for wisdom and success to objectively evaluate FUMC's health and God's guidance in developing strong, workable action plans as He would desire. The next stage will involve focus groups with as many church members as possible to identify strategies to strengthen our areas in need of growth. Finally, many of you will be involved in activities to strengthen FUMC's mission in the future. Mission Control will be providing information regularly to all of FUMC's church body. Please feel free to contact Melissa Walker, chair of Mission Control, or any MC member with questions about this process. We look forward to continuing to grow the body of Christ at FUMC through this exciting process.

FUMC Marion to Launch Financial Ministry

God has inspired writers to craft over 800 Bible verses on handling money. Our nation would not be facing the greatest economic struggle in history if past and present generations would have followed one of these God inspired principles; Proverbs 22:7, "The rich rule over the poor, and the borrower is slave of the lender" (NRSV). This one Proverb would have prevented these staggering numbers from being headline news. In February alone, 121,000 homes went into foreclosure, an increase of 67%, and 650,000 people lost their jobs.

It is numbers like these that have inspired a group of Financial Peace fanatics at FUMC to listen to God's call and start a Financial Ministry at FUMC. The Financial Ministry team with the support of the Committee on Finance and Stewardship, and Christian Education department has developed three objectives to address the needs of our congregation and community in these historic times.

- **First**, the Financial Ministry is working hand in hand with the Caring Ministry to assist those who are in financial distress and have had a recent job loss. We are searching for individuals with experience in financial counseling, résumé development, or would like to encourage someone who has lost their job. If you believe you are called to this, please contact Vicki Standley at 377-4856 or vicki@fumcmarion.org.
- **The second objective** is continuing to provide Financial Peace University to the community. We have created a partnership with a few of the other churches in Marion and Northeast Linn County to reach out to their congregations. The fall 2009 class has been scheduled to start on August 26th and a summer class is currently being sought.
- **The third objective** of this ministry is reaching out to the youth. Did you know that one in three teens carry a credit card, 19 percent of 18 to 24 year olds declared bankruptcy in 2001, or that the average debt of a college student at graduation is \$20,000? Take a moment and think of what your education on money management was when you were in high school. Did you know how to budget? How about dealing with credit and debt? In cooperation with youth leaders we are reviewing a five week program called "Generation Change." This program will teach teens that it's not stuff that makes them, but God, the hazards of debt, how to create an age appropriate budget, using the envelope system, and understanding the concept of giving.

We are living in an economic rollercoaster. Our church's role in this situation ought to be to teach financial literacy – how to be good stewards of God's money and help those who are finding it difficult to navigate out the hard times.
