We Need a Field

On a recent autumn day I looked out my window at a corn crop nearly ready for the harvest. As I sipped my morning coffee, I thought what an appropriate visual for our *"Believe"* campaign.

First and obviously, this image is appropriate because our Lord Jesus referred to those who did not know him yet as the harvest, and admonished those who followed him to be harvesters and pray for those who might come alongside them to help with the harvest. This is the mission of the church – to win souls to Christ and nurture them into the kingdom.

Secondly, the image of a field is appropriate for the *Believe* campaign because we are a church that takes seriously the great commandment. *"Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your strength – AND – love your neighbor as yourself."* Because we believe our love for God naturally flows from us into specific, concrete acts of service. Ministries like our Christian Education program, FLY, the Turkey Trot, recovery from the flood of 2008, Grief Share, Men's Fraternity, Divorce Care, our youth ministry and many more are our reach to the mission field.

Thirdly, the image of a field is appropriate for the *Believe* campaign because we need one. We need a field; a field well positioned and ready to be part of a legacy and magnificent future of faith.

For over a hundred years First United Methodist Church has stood proudly under her steeple and done bold ministry from the corner of 12th and 8th in down-

town Marion. I have been raised in the buildings that are First United Methodist Church. Our home was an extension of it. They make my heart happy.

My siblings were married, my father's resurrection to eternal life, my confirmation, call to ministry, first sermon and for that matter my first kiss (on the cheek of a girl named Monica) all were celebrated there. Many holy and important life moments have been hosted there. These are part of our legacy to the community.

In the 115 years of our church buildings term of service, Marion has grown from 5,000 to 32,000 residents, growth that continues as far as all the experts can see. The old buildings have served well but now their limitations have begun to shape who we are. Every ministry we do is shaped by the buildings, and that is not right. Buildings are not to shape people. People are to shape buildings.

Thus, we need a field. We need a field to continue that legacy and accommodate the building needs of God's Kingdom here in Marion. We need a field where the legacy can be built upon and expanded.

- We need a field where Marion is growing, a field that will be surrounded by neighbors in 10 or 20 years.
- We need a field where, with God's help, facilities can be built that are easily accessed by young and old.
- We need a field where with God's help we can build a Christian community with like minded partners that provide ministries and services that help accomplish our mission.

- We need a field where we can build ample fellowship space to fit the needs of the current congregation and the one we are to grow into.

- We need a field where we can build indoor and outdoor play space for children and youth.

- We need a field where we can build for the generations to come a vessel through which they can minister to our community in many of the ways we have and in ways that are appropriate to their generations.

- We need a field where we can build an edifice or set of edifices for Christian worship that represent our gratitude to God.

- We need a field that represents the spot where we give the biggest GIFT to our Lord that we have ever given.

- We need a field.

Of course, unless someone gives us the right field, we need to buy that field and the sole purpose of the Believe campaign to raise the money to get that field. As your pastor, I admonish us all to prayerfully and thoughtfully consider an affirmative and generous response. The vision is clear. We need to get the field, the field that in years to come will become home to First United Methodist Church of Marion and her partners in Christian community.

I believe we are to assist God in accomplishing His purposes for our lives in the building of a Christian community here and now and the next step seems to be to get that field!

The annual Bazaar is the major fundraiser to financially support UMW's many missions. Our UMW unit makes a yearly pledge to our national organization through our East Central Division. Plus we contribute to the UMW supported projects in Iowa, Shesler Hall, Bidwell Center and Hawthorne Hill Ministries. Each of these facilities serves women and children in need. Each circle also designates

a portion of the money raised from the Bazaar to local organizations and/or projects. UMW funds come from member pledges and proceeds of the annual Bazaar. Congregational support is critical to our success.

Since 1842 when a group organized to sew warm clothing for poor children in the community, the women of this church have worked together to serve our church family and our community. Some UMW members joined the WSCS (Women's Society of Christian Service) as young mothers and have seen many changes over the years that have led to what is now known as UMW (United Methodist Women). But one thing has never changed: our purpose. We are a community of women whose purpose is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the ministries of the church.

The UMW unit of this church is an active, diverse and talented mix of women in 16 unique circles. Members are young & not so young. They are teenagers, career women, retirees, homemakers, young mothers to grandmothers. We are serious about our faith and we are serious about finding joy in our lives and bringing that joy to others. Laughing, crying, and praying, we are real

women living in our very real, challenging world and we find strength and support from our sisters in faith through being a UMW member. Members have found that they can use their God-given talents to reach out to help others and glorify God.

Members say this about what UMW means to them.

"UMW has given me a way to find who I am and how I can be of service to God. UMW has expanded my insight into many things 'outside my box'"

"We worship together, help each other, have fun together, make lasting friendships, and try to be God's hands in local, state, national, and worldwide mission. It is a privilege to be a member of a group dedicated to loving and serving in Jesus' name."

"I was new to Marion and just joined the church. Rebekah circle welcomed me. My circle of friends increased"

Circles work all year on programs and projects to learn more about the world we live in and how we as Christian women can reach out and support each other and those in need around us.

An example of what God can do through a few dedicated women is the current project of the Mary/Agape circle that specializes in making crafts to give to others. They are busy making more

Our church made approximately \$1000 last Nov. for flood relief and choir. Choir is also selling the booklets for choir fund.

Also, a big thank you to all the persons that helped fill and pack the bags. These include the 30 energetic children in the 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade Sunday School classes, the small but mighty UMW teen circle and leaders, and the 20 mission-minded persons that helped on the Sept.23 packing day.

Finally, a big thank you to all of the 28 faithful home sewers and the 46 enthusiastic women that came to school bag sewing day in July to sew, cut, pin, or iron. Several bags are still in process, but it is projected that we will have sewn a little over 2000 bags. The extra 800 unfilled bags will be welcome at the UMCOR Depot (United Methodist Committee on Relief) to use for their bulk buying supplies.

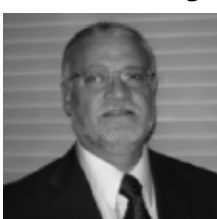
At least 700 yards of fabric were used to sew the bags. Medium-weight colorful fabric donations or money to buy fabric are welcome year around.

We also want to give a big advance thank you to the youth that will help us load and the 4 drivers that will transport the 115 boxes to the Ingathering at the Cedar Falls UMC on Sat., Nov. 7. They will then be sent on to the UMCOR Depot in Baldwin, Louisiana, where they will be distributed to needy areas in the U.S. and around the world.
