Toby Waldowski was born and raised in Webster, South Dakota. His mother was a piano teacher and forced him to

practice the piano 30 minutes every morning before school. Toby became a Christian on August 14, 1971 while watching a Billy Graham Crusade on television. He was 17 years old at the time.

In 1976, after college graduation and marriage, Toby and his wife, Barb attended a music ministry conference at the Crystal Cathedral in Garden Grove, CA. While at the conference they auditioned to sing for Dr. Robert Schuller and his wife Arvella. They were offered a position on the music staff at the Cathedral and they moved to Orange County, CA where they reside to this day. Toby and Barb were featured soloists on Dr. Schuller's "Hour of Power," program for 20 years giving over 125 solo appearances on that program.

In 1977 Toby and Barb started a traveling ministry throughout North America that ministry lasted 26 years. During those years Toby and Barb recorded 11 albums, gave over 4,000 concerts and were guest soloists in two Billy Graham Crusades, one of which took place in Toby and Barb's home state of South Dakota. Toby's song "South Dakota My Home," was sung at the 50th anniversary of the Mt. Rushmore Memorial in 1992.

Some years ago, I was out calling on some folks that claimed membership in the church. Their suburban home was beautifully painted, artistically landscaped and the front door was accompanied by two magnificent pillars. The sign by the doorbell said: "the xxxx's are glad you have come to our home, please ring the bell" and before the door was a giant red carpet mat with 6 inch letters that simply said "welcome."

Not everyone is comfortable meeting people for the first time, and in my spirit there is always some fear and trepidation in the moments just before such a meeting. But, anyone would love to approach this door. Heck, I thought, maybe the parcel drivers stopped by everyday just to receive a welcome like and feel really wanted. Completely at ease, I reached over and rang the doorbell.

"Who the *#@ is it?"

Silence.

"Who the *#@ is at the door and what do you want?"

For some reason a great dissonance dropped over my spirit, the physical environment I was in did not match my emotions and I was trapped. All that was available to me was to feebly call back "Pastor Mike."

"We go to the Methodist Church and everything is fine, we don't need anything. Go see someone else."

Confused silence.

Walking back to my car I saw the rock at the edge of the driveway with two playful squirrels exclaiming to me "come back again friend!"

Wow. I had been duped; the welcome mat was pulled out from under me, my spirit crashed.

From time to time, it seems this has happened to people as they seek their place, as they seek to encounter our Lord, as they seek a welcome in the Christian church.

Paul in his letter to the Romans instructing Christians wrote: "Always be eager to practice hospitality." The practice of hospitality has never been about slick marketing tools, neat programs or powerpoint presentations; the practice of hospitality is a lifestyle. It is a lifestyle of caring for others, inviting others, taking time for others, giving part of something we love to others. Elsewhere in this issue of the *Marion Methodist*, Karen Schmitz, our Membership Assimilation Coordinator, gives witness to some acts of hospitality that are examples of who God desires us as a people to be. The good news is that there are hundreds more.

My admonition in this issue is simple. Give evaluating thought to how we and you can be more hospitable as we seek to fulfill God's great purpose and mission here in our community.

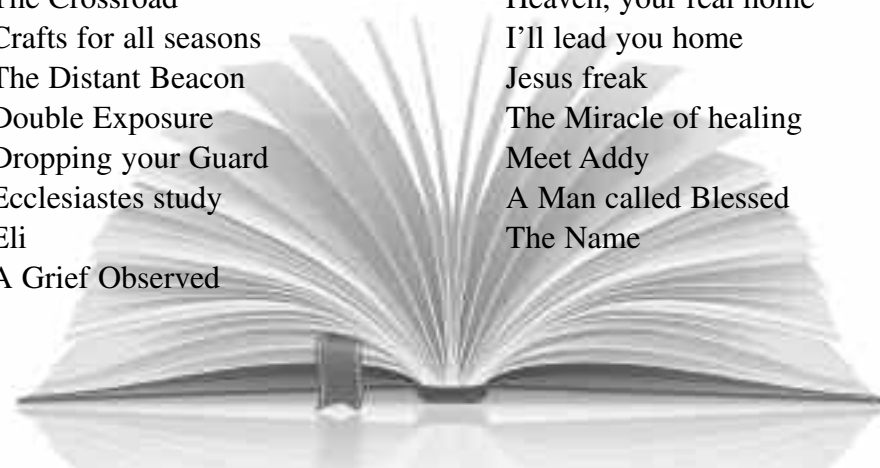
