“That’s Audacious”

The nose bleed seats at Williams Brice stadium in Columbia, South Carolina are a very spiritual place. Home of the football playing University of South Carolina Gamecocks most of the time, my experience of it was as a sanctuary, not to football but to the living God.

In 1987, I attended the Billy Graham School of Evangelism and went to the crusade meetings at the stadium in the evening. The preacher spoke each night, his ministry framed by the music of Cliff Barrows, the legendary George Beverly Shea and a local choir of a thousand or so voices. Testimonies were given by celebrities of stage and screen and the playing field.

Each evening the stadium was filled seemingly with the good folks from the local churches who for years had desired to brush up against the ministry of the prolific evangelist and his musical entourage. They had spent months plotting and planning, praying and preparing for this week, and here it was. Watching it all from the nose-bleed seats, in a lot of ways, it seemed a lot like the church services I had been at the previous weekend, with the exception being the oppressive South Carolina humidity.

I wondered sitting there above it all how many people – if any in the large crowd were not Christian or at least churched. My question was answered not long after I asked it.

Plopping down beside me smelling like a day of construction work with Budweiser poured over it, came a man who I never saw before or since. We began to talk, but only about the things guys tend to talk about. About 5 minutes in and over the voices of the assembled voices of the combined choirs of the Columbia Churches, he asked me – “do you think a guy like me can be forgiven?”

I wanted to ask for what. I wanted to probe into his life and get some details. I wondered myself why he would relatively lead with that. Nevertheless, here was the question of questions and I knew the Lord put us up in those cheap seats that night for a reason, so I didn’t flinch. I simply said “yes.”

“How do you know?” he said.

Reaching for theologically deep words but finding none

I asked him if he knew what a pardon was. He said, yes, like getting clemency, getting off for something you have done. Right, I said. God has chosen mercy for you and me – he has chosen to forgive us rather than execute us for our sins. He said, no matter what? No matter what I said – as long as you receive Jesus as your Lord and Savior.

He looked at me and said, “that is audacious!”

I had never heard the word before, but it seemed like he was affirming what I said, so I nodded and smiled.

He pointed at the stage and said; “Shhh...I love this guy, this is what I came for.”

The guy he loved was “Pistol” Pete Maravich who averaged 47 points a game for LSU in college (before the 3 point line). Pete had looked everywhere for love and forgiveness throughout his life and found it in Jesus.

“That’s audacious”, my seat mate kept saying over and over throughout his talk.

Then came the preacher who talked of the atoning blood of Jesus granting us our freedom from sin and death and who answered our deepest quest – forgiveness – by granting it to us. By now, my construction working friend must have said “that’s audacious” a dozen or more times.

At the end of the service Graham made the call he had made a thousand times before as the choir sang “Just as I am, without one plea.” My friend asked – “have you ever heard this song before?” I nodded. “Do you believe it?” I nodded again. “It’s audacious!”

Then, like a man shot out of a cannon at a county fair he was down the steps and a few moments later I saw him emerge on to the playing surface of the stadium into the arms of one of the counselors on the field. I don’t know his name and haven’t seen him since, but that night was a life changer for him.

Audacious means to be fearlessly reckless or bold – which of course describes Jesus’ love for us and describes how we must act for him if we receive it. It’s a word I am glad I learned one night in the cheap seats of a ballfield.

I'll never forget it. It felt like a monsoon. My guys were around me adding their tears to the pouring rain. Mothers were holding their cameras covered in plastic bags to keep the rain off their precious memories. Priceless pictures were being taken that night of muddied football players posing in front of the scoreboard. Finally it had all paid off... we had won.

24 games without a victory is a long time. Most of the young men in our high school had given up on the program and turned in their football pads. Some stuck around. These guys showed up as the coaches ramped up the weight room requirements and fought against every negative comment in the school with hard work and faith. As I look around

the First United Methodist Church on Sundays, I see a lot of the same kids who stuck around our football program.

I've always had a tough time figuring out why God loves faith so much he rewards us with everlasting life. I always wondered why faith was the quality that God wanted people to have. Why couldn't it be quality of heart, or kindness? As he always does, God showed me the reason with living proof: there is nothing as powerful as faith. Sometimes it works and you get earthly rewards like we did that rainy night and sometimes you only reap heavenly ones. But God wants us to keep fighting and believing. That's a challenge that I like the sound of. --CJ McDonald
