## What is next in the building process?

Everyone associated with First United Methodist is interested in what is going on regarding our buildings. While the Building Committee process is involved, and takes time, it is important to share as much information as possible. Below are a few questions that have been asked of me recently and the answers that we know to be true at this moment. Input is needed from everyone, so please ask your questions!!!

**Q: What is next in the building process?"**

A: Cargill and Associates are processing the feasibility study and will present the results at the "In Focus" Workshop on Sunday, September 13th 4-7 PM. Everyone is invited to attend. Please fill out an RSVP form or call the church office so we can have adequate refreshments.

**Q: Where is the land we are considering?"**

A: The Building Committee is estimating we'll need a campus of 35-70 acres that is in the prime growth area of Marion, north and east of our current location.

**Q: Why so far out?"**

A: For years church real estate was

based on: "location, location, location" which has been replaced in the growing churches (here and elsewhere) of this century by the phrase "access, access, access."

**Q: Is Jiffy Lube being given to the church? If it is will that change our plan?"**

A: No one associated with Jiffy Lube has spoken to anyone at the church about giving the property to FUMC. This amount of property would not allow us to accomplish any of the goals set forth in the vision regarding access, program or mission.

**Q: What will we do with our current facilities?"**

A: No decisions of any kind have been made on this question.

**Q: What will our new buildings look like?"**

A: No building designs have been made at this point. They will be designed by the congregation led by the building committee. Currently there are some rough drawings to stimulate your imagination on the main hallway bulletin board regarding the "community" concept.

**Q: How much money do we need?"**

A: The target for this campaign is 2.6 million dollars. In order to initiate this great vision, we must conduct a capital campaign and raise the resources to purchase and develop land and possibly even begin a first phase of construction.

**Q: When will we buy the land?"**

A: If the feasibility study instructs us to go forward, we will purchase land when we have the money in hand to do so.

**Q: What I can do to be involved in the process?"**

A: Reread the Vision statement sent out with the feasibility study and attend the church wide In-Focus Workshop Sunday, September 13 presented by our campaign consultant that will include the results of the survey and time for discussion, questions and dreaming. Pray for our Building Committee, the leadership and unity of our church, Dr. Steve McSwain, our campaign consultant, your involvement and participation in the campaign and MOST IMPORTANTLY God's will to be accomplished AT First United Methodist Church in Marion.

## Pastor for Youth and Mission Search Update

The staffing plan at First United Methodist Church has been over five years to arrive at a place where we have persons right for the ministry we need and piece by piece we have put that plan into place.

The growth committee identified that the next position we needed was a Pastor for Youth and Mission. Pastor Melisa Bracht-Wagner filled this role and, as we know, built with God's help and the congregation's will, a strong youth program and a mission program without peer in this area.

The next step, finding the right person to be our Pastor for Youth and Mission, is important and must be taken deliberately. The job description has been in place and includes the following:

The Pastor of Youth and Mission will join a staff and congregation that is passionate for Christ and this community. The Pastor of Youth and Mission is to be a person who is an example to youth leaders, youth and their families through personal character and witness, maintaining a lifestyle in accordance with Holy Scripture. Further they must be strong leader/teacher/mentor able to fill three primary roles.

1. Lead and further develop a large (over 100 participants) and growing youth program.
2. Lead and further develop an already active local, national and global mission program.
3. Provide leadership for part time employees on youth, children and mission staff.

Staff Parish in consultation with our Bishop and Conference Superintendent has determined that this is a specialist position and thus, they have granted us the ability to do a national search for the right person. This means, our new person will likely not be an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church but rather a person with specific education in youth ministry and significant success in youth and mission ministries.

While a search like this will take time (our philosophy is "right not rushed") and will include more people in the interview process, we are endeavoring to fill the position as soon as possible. Pray for the SPRC and for the right candidate to emerge in this exciting, scary and wonderful time.

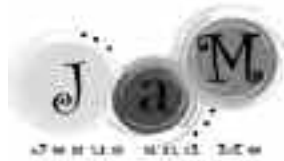

## Trustee Update:

### We have been busy on your behalf....

1. In the lower level of the education building, you will smell fresh paint and new carpeting in the hallway and 5 rooms. Now that we are no longer housing flood volunteers we have utilized funding from the facility fees that have been collected from those teams to refurbish rooms 105, 106 and 107 back into Christian education classrooms. Caring Corner Daycare has funded the new carpeting in the hallway and in rooms 101 and 102.
2. Repairs and new tuck pointing of the main stairs entering the church on 12th Street has begun. Years of salt and ice have degraded the mortar and has necessitated the repairs. A new rubber membrane behind the lime stone and flashing will prevent future salt and ice damage.
3. Is the flood office leaving FUMC? No! The Trustees have agreed unanimously that flood recovery is an important mission and we want Pastor Melisa on our campus! So the ministries of flood recovery and FLY will be staying in the same building, but moving in the next couple of months to the south side of that building and the north side will become additional space for Christian education. As FUMC's donation and continued support to flood recovery, no rent will be collected at this time. This represents a savings of \$750.00/month for flood recovery.
